A monument with meaning

New interpretative display in Annapolis Royal will help share the story of the Acadians

crucial piece of Acadian history will soon be displayed on a monument overlooking the wharf where part of it occurred.

The 10,000-pound Acadian Odyssey Commission monument commemorates the Great Upheaval, also known as the Grand Dérangement and Acadian Expulsion, It saw nearly 10,000 Acadians deported from the Maritime provinces between 1755 and

1762. British authorities gavethe order on July 28, 1755. At 5 a.m. on Dec. 8, 1755, Acadians were separated from family members, forced at ganpoint to board seven ships from the wharf in Annapolis Royal and sent to Anglo-American colonies, England and France. In total, 1,664 men, women and children were deported from Annapolis Royal.

Alan Melanson, the past president of The Historical Association of Annapolis Royal, watched the installation of the monument at Fort Anne National Historic Site on Nov. 2.

It's very moving," said Melanson, who had ancestors deported from the site. I'm Acadian, but we only learned about the deportation st Grand Pre. We didn't learn about the other (sites)."

He moved to the area in 1977 and said at that time there was nothing explaining. the deportation.

Twe made a mission of trying to explain the Acadian story verbally for 40 years," he said, noting how proud he was to see the story would continue to be told, "This monument will outlive us all."

PARKS CANADA

Ted Dolan worked on a renewal of the interpretative exhibits at Fort Anne before becoming Parks Canada's

visitor experience and site manager for the national historic sites in Southwest Nova. Scotia in 2018.

'One of the things that became really apparent to me, as I got to know the history really well of this site, (was) there was not much Acadian presence on the grounds," he said, noting there is an Acadian room inside the Officers' Quarters Museum.

The Acadian story of the region captivated him and he was surprised bow few Acadians he spoke with understood Fort Anne was also an Acadian site. Many considered it a military site.

Once you know the history of this area, it's a lot more

than that," Dolan said. "Personally, I think it's one of the most important Acadian sites in Nova Scotia."

He said it is where Charles de Menou d'Aulnay brought the colonists who started identifying themselves as Acadians.

Right on these shores right here," he said, turning to look out towards the Annapolis Basin, "is where the families started dike farming.

Officials from Parks Canada and the association worked with the commission to make the project come to fruition. The monument also describes Port Royal, the first permanent European settlement in

Canada, the Acadians' strong relationship with the Mikmaq and how they created the rich

Commission president Jean I. Gaudet said it was critical to recognize the Acadian history on the site.

"That is where the first families settled in Annapolis Royal, along the Annapolis River," he said, noting it was then called the Dauphin River and families built homes all the way to Paradise.

"That is a very important element of the original Acadian history. That's where the first families were settled."

Gaudet said Assumption Life took up the mission to raise the \$100,000 needed for the

At this point, The Historical Association of Annapolis Royal and Assumption Life are the major donors followed by Comeau's Sea Foods Limited and the Ronaldo Bourgeois family with fundraising efforts ongoing. A plaque will be installed on the monument recognizing the contributions that made the project a reality.

The association had been planning on placing a monument at the site since 2019 as part of its contribution to the Acadian World Congress in 2024. Melanson said they were glad to be part of the collaborative project.

This is what I always had in mind," he said looking at the installed monument. "I think that there should be pride in this.

There are 18 other Acadian Odyssey monuments located in Nova Scotia, New Brunswick, Prince Edward Island, Newfoundland and Labrador. Quebec, Louisiana as well as Saint Pierre and Miquelon.

were unveiled in Halifax and Dieppe, N.B., on July 28, 2005. There are also monuments in Nova Scotia at Université Sainte-Anne in Church Point and the Musée des Aradiens des Pubnicos in West Pubnico.

Annapolis Royal was a site that was missing in the picture," Melanson said.

ORIENTATION

Dolan explained the group decided on having the monument overlook the wharf as it would allow visitors to visualize the last steps the Acadians took before boarding the

ships. We wanted people to be able to look at the monument and take in the environment. take in the landscape," he said. This is largely an undisturbed landscape. This is what the Acadians would have been looking at as they were boarding the ships as well. It's very powerful."

Gaudet said it is a unique site where the French settlers arrived and the Acadians were deported from.

The drone picture that Robert (Surette) took shows the entrance to the basin. where (Samuel de) Champlain came in in 1605 and where the deportees were sent through to New England in 1755 on Dec. 8."

Melanson said the region looks similar to what it did nearly 270 years ago.

If Champlain came here today, sailed in this basin, he would recognize this," he said. This is a pristine, historic, cultural landscape."

CEREMONY

A public ceremony will be held at the site on Dec. 8 at 1:30 p.m.

"Everyone is welcome," Gaudet said. "The more the merrier.

Gaudet said he is forever grateful to Melanson, Surette and Dolan for their dedicated work on the project and others telling the Acadian history of the region.

Gaudet said he anticipates the town will see more people visiting the site in the future as they make their way from Windsor and Grand Pre to Clare and Pubnico.

'It's going to be an important stop along that trail," he

Melanson hopes people visit the site to learn more about its significance.

'If somebody comes to Nova Scotia seeking Acadian history, and they don't come here, they've missed the boat."
